Building the Bridge: Effective Collaboration and Coordination for Youth, Families and Communities Impacted by Substance Abuse & Mental Health Issues

Danielle will discuss a developmentally-matched, family-focused and interdisciplinary framework that capitalizes on youth and family motivation, uses creative engagement strategies and increases access to treatment services to support the health and wellness of youth, families and communities. Danielle will also discuss several community-based initiatives that support the health and wellbeing of youth, families and communities.

Cardiology

Did you know 1 in 100 children are born with a congenital heart disease? Kristina presents an overview on congenital heart defects, associated genetic conditions, arrhythmias, common cardiac medications and neurodevelopmental concerns. She will discuss what to look for, management and common outpatient monitoring devices as well as medications and neurodevelopment monitoring.

Cystic Fibrosis

Emily will explore an overview of cystic fibrosis as a multi system disease. She will identify different ways that cystic fibrosis affects home life and how that might transcend into the class room, including accommodations to improve supports for the student and minimize barriers to learning. Christine will discuss the increased rate of anxiety and depression in students with CF and the ways schools may be able to support both medical and emotional needs while in the school environment.
