Speakers

Erin Maughan, PhD, MS, RN, PHNA-BC, FAAN, ENASN currently serves as the Director of Research for NASN. Before coming to NASN full-time (in August 2012) she was a member of the faculty in the College of Nursing at Brigham Young University (BYU) for the past eight years, where she taught public health nursing, global health (study abroad programs), and served as Coordinator of International Affairs for the College. She also served as chair of the School Nurse Educator Consortium. Dr Maughan's research focuses on issues related to school nurse staffing, school health outcomes, and cultural competency.

Leah Matteson, DNS (c), RN, CNS is an Associate Professor of Nursing at Castleton University. She started her career in nursing over 50 years ago. She is a community health clinical nurse specialist and has completed a post-masters certification as a psychiatric nurse practitioner. Leah has worked in critical care, public health, disaster preparedness, long-term care, home-health and hospice, psychiatric care, and nursing education.
